Presenter Guidelines

- Presenters may do a short (5-10 min) presentation (slides, stories, pictures) and/or bring a poster and pamphlets
- Visual media such as photos, art and graphics are strongly encouraged
- Presentation, poster and pamphlet text should be large and kept to a minimum. Avoid the use of technical language and jargon
- Be mindful of your positionality as a researcher - keep an open mind, be patient and considerate. Remember that all things are connected
- In honouring the importance of reciprocity in research, presenters are encouraged to be explicit about the benefits of their work for community, in addition to expressing gratitude for the benefits working with/in community has brought to them
- Field gear, props, gifts, and swag are encouraged
- Presenters can use this opportunity to advertise employment positions
- Posters should be printed ahead of the event and presentations must be available offline (no internet at event)
